

2015 CHAPTER GENERAL (CAPITOLO GENERALE) OF THE SAVOY ORDERS



Geneva

The annual international reunion and assembly of the 2015 Chapter General (Capitolo Generale) of the Dynastic Orders of the Royal House of Savoy was held in Geneva and at the Abbey of Saint Maurice d'Agaune (September 26 - September 27). It was a memorable occasion for members of the American Delegation who participated in the weekend's traditional ceremonies presided over by the Grand Master, HRH Prince Victor Emmanuel of Savoy. The return of the Chapter General to Switzerland was to commemorate the 1500th jubilee anniversary of the founding of the ancient abbey of Saint Maurice that commemorates the site of the saint's martyrdom. And, historically Geneva was once the center of political power of the early Counts and Dukes of Savoy, who had controlled both shores of Lake Geneva. This connection with the Savoy dynasty made the city an ideal setting for members of the Savoy Orders from all over the world to congregate and reaffirm in the 21st century, their millennial traditions and chivalric ideals.

The official investiture ceremony of the presentation of diplomas to new members and to those being promoted in the Orders of Merit of Savoy and of Saints Maurice and Lazarus took place in the Hotel President Wilson on Saturday, the 26th. It was followed by the traditional Gala dinner in the grand ballroom of the hotel with about 200 members and guests. On Sunday morning, the knights and dames, transported by buses to the historic Abbey of Saint Maurice d'Agaune in the Valais region of the Alps, donned their church mantles and processed into the abbey for a Solemn Mass in the presence of the Royal Family. Following the Mass, members and guests participated in a benefit luncheon, which brought to an end this convivial and confraternal assembly in the Savoy dynasty's territory of origin.


















MASS AND CAPITOLO GENERALE AT THE ABBEY OF ST. MAURICE D'AGAUNE

Sunday, September 27, 2015

On a glorious, sunny Sunday morning, the American Delegation, joined our confreres in the international Savoy Orders and departed from the Hotel President Wilson on board a bus provided by the Chancellery for our pilgrimage to the 1500 year old Abbey of Saint Maurice in the Swiss village of Saint Maurice d'Agaune, to participate in the annual Procession and Solemn Mass. The Abbey was constructed on the site where Saint Maurice and his companions, all Christian Roman soldiers of the Theban Legion, were martyred for refusing to renounce their faith. Saint Maurice is the Patron Saint of Savoy and of many Swiss, French and Savoyard villages as well as the Patron Saint and Protector of the Italian Royal Approximately 200 robed House. members of the Savoy Orders processed with the Grand Master.

Passing through some of the most beautiful landscape in southwestern Switzerland following the shoreline of Lake Geneva – Lausanne and Montreux – and by the ancient Savoy Castle of Chillon and dozens of small vineyards and villages – the American Delegation arrived at about 11:00 am at the historic abbey.

PROCESSION INTO THE ABBEY



The Chapter Mass was celebrated at Abbey of Saint-Maurice d'Agaune in the presence of Their Royal Highnesses Prince Victor Emmanuel, Duke of Savoy, Princesses Marina and Maria Pia of Savoy and Prince Serge of Yugoslavia. The Solemn Mass was celebrated by Cav. Gr. Cr. Monsignor Paolo De Nicolo, Titular Bishop of Mariana (Corsica), Grand Prior of the Dynastic Orders, assisted by Chaplains of the Order of Saints Maurice and Lazarus. Approximately 200 robed members of the Savoy Orders processed with the Grand Master. This was an exceptional occasion due to the closing of the Jubilee Year celebrating the one thousand five hundredth anniversary of the founding of the Abbey. The oldest active abbey of the West, it is administered by the Canons Regular of St. Augustine, which preserve the treasures and relics of the martyrs of the Theban Legion, especially those of Saint Maurice, the patron saint. The sacred relics of Saint Maurice, encased in an ornate gold reliquary, rarely displayed, were on view during the annual Mass, as tradition dictates. The powerful and extraordinary choir and soloists enhanced the majesty of the ancient religious ceremony.

Ancient Annecy

DELEGATION TOUR OF HISTORIC SAVOY SITES IN SAVOY, FRANCE

For many years, the members of the American Delegation of Savoy Orders have participated in an annual tour on the day after the Capitolo Generale. This year's tour of historic Savoy sites in the Savoy region of France provided a glimpse into the intimately interwoven history of the Savoy dynasty with the Savoy region.

The Delegate, Cav. Gr. Cr. Avv. Carl J. Morelli, led the *cavalieri* and *dame* from New York, Texas and Connecticut joined by family members. The tour contingent consisted of Cav. Henry V. Campbell III, Dama Jolanta Fabicka, Uff. Avv. Frank Desiderio and Mrs. Barbara Desiderio, Cav. Dott. Allen Marchetti, Cav. Very Rev. Canon Matthew Mauriello and Cav. Anthony Schembri, Jr. The tour departed from the Hotel President Wilson to the ancient Royal Abbey of Hautecombe, followed by lunch in the Michelin rated *L'Auberge du Père Bise* and a tour of Annecy Castle in the Savoie region in France.

Passing bucolic villages and alpine passes and accompanied once again by English speaking tour guide, Mme. Chantal George, the tour group crossed the border from Switzerland into Savoy, France. Under the sovereignty of the Savoy Dynasty from about 1,000 to 1860, this greatly coveted frontier region was for centuries a nation in its own right, powerful and independent, with its own rich history and traditions.



The Royal Abbey of Hautecombe

Located on the west bank of Le Bourget Lake, overlooking the expansive lake, is a historic jewel, the Royal Abbey of Hautecombe, built in the troubadour Gothic style. It is renowned as a spiritual center and for being the necropolis of the early members of the House of Savoy and several of the later Savoy kings and queens. A former Cistercian monastery and later a Benedictine monastery, it is the most widely visited monument in Savoy located in Saint-Pierre-de Curtille near Aix-les-Bains, in Savoy, France.

Hautecombe was for centuries the burial-place of the Counts of Savoy. Count Humbert III (1135-1189), known as "Blessed", and his wife Anne were interred there in the latter part of the 12th century; and about a century later Boniface of Savoy, **Archbishop** Canterbury (1245-1270), son of Count Thomas I of Savoy, was buried in the sanctuary of the abbey church. He had come from England with King Edward I to accompany him on a crusade, but died at the castle of St. Helena in Savoy. The abbot Anthony of Savoy, a son of Charles Emmanuel I, was also buried there in 1673 as was the Savoy King Charles Felix of Sardinia-Piedmont after his death in 1831.

The last Savoy king of Italy, **Umberto II**, was entombed in a separate chapel in 1983 and was joined with his wife **Queen Marie-José** following her death in 2001.


1:00 pm Lunch: L'Auberge du Père Bise, Annecy, Haute Savoie, France



After working up an appetite touring the expansive Abbey, the tour group was taken to a picturesque regional and historic restaurant, the irresistibly charming *L'Auberge du Père Bise*. The menu is an elegant blend of classicism and modernity, particularly known for offering refined gourmet preparations using fish from Annecy Lake with a perfect combination of the most savory ingredients. Idyllically located on the banks of Lake Annecy in the village of Talloires, 30 miles south of Geneva, the one-hundred year-old inn is at once elegant, charming and sophisticated. Michelin rated, it is one of only 19 top establishments in France.

Surrounded by protective mountains, the water of Lake Annecy is reputed to be one of the cleanest in the world, inspiring Paul Cezanne's splendid painting of the same name. The *Père Bise* offered breathtaking views from its terrace on the lake. The chef Sophie Bise is famous for her creative dishes using only regional and local fresh products, which are also sculpted to look as lovely as they taste, prepared an exquisite menu for the tour members.


2:30 pm Tour of Annecy and Château d'Annecy



After the sumptuous gourmet luncheon, the Savoy tour members departed for the ancient town of Annecy, which is located between Geneva and the old Savoy capital of Chambéry. Its history was strongly influenced by these two towns between the 10th and the 19th centuries. Starting as the capital of the county of Geneva, after the demise of the last of the Counts of Geneva, it became integrated into the House of Savoy's possessions in 1401. In 1444, the town was designated by the Princes of Savoy as the capital of a region embracing their possessions of the Genevois, Faucigny and Beaufortain.

With the advance of Calvinism in 1535, it became a center for the Counterreformation and the bishop's See of Geneva was transferred here. Saint Francis of Sales who was bishop of Annecy, was born at the nearby castle of Sales in 1567.

In 1416, Amadeus VIII, the count of Savoy became the family's first Duke of Savoy, a title which was to legitimize at European level the geostrategic role of Savoy and which was to earn its rulers the appellation of "Gatekeepers of the Alps," since they controlled key western crossings from Northern Europe into the Italian peninsula. With the gradual unification of the Italian regions by the House of Savoy, the Savoy region was ceded to France on June 14, 1860, the last province to become part of the French nation.

Before returning to Geneva, members toured the quaint ancient streets of Annecy and the Chateau d'Annecy, a fortress which dominates the old French town. It was bought by the town, restored and transformed into a museum, *le musée-château d'Annecy*. The castle is listed as a "monument historique" by the French Ministry of Culture.
