George White, overlooking Long Island Sound in Waterford, Connecticut on July 31, a sunny summery Saturday. Uff. Avv. Roy De Barbieri graciously co-hosted the event with his wife Patricia. Some guests came by train, some by car and some by ferry from Orient Point, Long Island. Those that came by train were met and transported by Uff. Avv. Roy De Barbieri and Cav. Rev. Visiting the Whites was like a little excursion into the past. The classic stone house, built in 1913 by his grandfather, the renowned American impressionist painter, Henry Cooke White, known for his paintings of the Connecticut landscape and shoreline, provided the backdrop for a quintessentially American experience. A five-piece Dixieland style band also added to the evocative atmosphere, transporting the guests in time to the Edwardian age when this area of Connecticut provided the imagery and timeless landscape of an idealized "old" America and attracted the largest, best-known Impressionist art colony in the nation. The aesthetic style furnishings and paintings of the period in the Whites' home accentuated the "somewhere in time" experience.























If that were not enough, Mother Nature enhanced the "plein air" dining with perfect summer weather - sunny, crystal clear skies with unobstructed panoramic vistas of the calm grey-blue waters of Long Island Sound. The sumptuous seafood hors d'oeuvres, the plentiful summertime cocktails, deliciously cooked filet mignon and other culinary delights under a cheerful yellow and white striped tent added to the "bon amie" spirit of the day. At about 6:00 p.m. as dusk was approaching, Uff. Avv. Roy De Barbieri had arranged for a cake decorated with the Savoy Royal flag, which the Delegate partitioned with Uff. George White's vintage military officer's sword, for the guests' enjoyment.



After dessert, George White introduced a Russian guest guitarist, Elena Soboleva, to perform for the guests, as sunset softly bathed the environs.
